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CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

In 2014, the Czech Association of Petroleum Industry and Trade (ČAPPO) focused its activities, as its priority, on the completion of implementation of its new organisation structure and implementation of the legislative measures to fight the tax frauds in motor fuels trading in practice.

The new organisational structure was implemented based on ČAPPO Statutes adopted at the General Meeting in June 2012. At the Annual General Meeting in June 2014, members of the Association noted that all of the changes were implemented and stood the test of time. Certain trouble continues to be with the increase in the number of the Association's members.

Throughout the year, the Association consistently applied the amendment of the Act on Fuels (Act No. 234/2013 Coll.). The Act contributed significantly to the reduction of tax frauds related to motor fuels trading. ČAPPO participated in the preparation of the amendment in compliance with the finding of the Constitutional Court file No. Pl. ÚS 44/13 concerning the security to be deposited by fuels distributors.

The Council, the Working Groups, and the Secretariat continued to address the current legislative and technical issues concerning blending of biofuels with motor fuels for transport, and specifically on the preparation of programmes to reduce greenhouse gases emissions originating from the fuels combustion and the preparation of amendments of Directives 2009/28/EC and 2009/30/EC to limit the use of the first generation biofuels and to prescribe the preference of the advanced biofuels. The Working Groups prepared and presented the analysis of the impact of these programs on the Czech petroleum industry. The Association presented the analysis to the public at the industry workshop Biofuels in Transport. Within the workshop, it issued its memorandum concerning the use of biofuels in transport.

In spite of our objections (in particular, as they relate to the economic and technical matters) concerning the duty to substitute fossil fuel components in motor fuels by first generation biofuels in accordance with Directive No. 2003/30/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on the promotion of the use of biofuels or other renewable motor fuels for transport, and in accordance with the Act on Air Protection, in the period 2007 to 2014 ČAPPO members fulfilled the volumes of fossil component substitution by biofuels in motor fuels prescribed by the Directive.

Over the course of 2014, the member firms, who are distributors of petroleum and petroleum products, achieved very good results concerning the quality of gasoline sold at service stations: the rate of defects totalled only 0.22% from collected samples, while the whole market achieved a rate of defects of 3.1%. The detected deviations in fuel quality from standard values did not influence the usage value of motor fuels. ČAPPO developed pressure on the state authorities to permit the Czech Trade Inspection to publish the significant deviations from quality standards observed at service stations, and finally

succeeded. The association regards this publication of the deviations, in particular, as a tool to detect tax frauds based on blending motor fuels with the non-standard fuels, and to protect the motorists. However, when it comes to publishing, the major deviations should be distinguished from small ones which cannot damage the engine, vehicle and the environment. To this end, it prepared the appropriate draft legislation to be included in the amendment of the Act on Motor fuels which is being prepared.

In the course of the year, the member companies were able to maintain a high share of the domestic producers and dealers in the motor fuels market as a result of the activities of petroleum processing firms of ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, of the company ČEPRO and other ČAPPO members.

On the level of the Council, Working Groups, and Secretariat, the Association addressed technical issues related to the range of motor fuels and alternative fuels and the development of their quality parameters, waste oils collection and management, tax policy related to the mineral oils, and amendments to technical standards and legislations. ČAPPO cooperated closely with the legislature, state administration bodies, the Office for Standards, Metrology, and Testing, foreign associations, the international association of petrochemical industry (FuelsEurope), as well as with domestic organisations, institutions, and universities

The Association has contributed to the development of new Czech technical standards in the areas of petroleum, lubricants and bitumen, analytical procedures and the operation of facilities for oil substances handling.

The Association significantly contributed to the implementation of some of the programmes of the EU. In particular, it focused on alternative fuels.

In the course of the year 2014, there was further increase in exchange of information and cooperation between ČAPPO and state authorities, the legislature and the expert public. Interest from the expert public and business entities in the opinions and documents of ČAPPO grew considerably, too. At the same time, the educational activities of the Association increased in the areas of the media, the Internet and in members' publications. Members of the Association took an active part in a number of conferences, seminars and workshops in the area of fuels, alternative motor fuels, and safety. ČAPPO updated its website on an on-going basis.

Again, the Association encouraged the administration and in particular the inspection entities to require more strictly the observance of legal standards and regulations from all competitors on the market. Here, it initiated, in particular, the development of a set of legislative and organisational measures to reduce tax evasions in relation to motor fuels trading via the amendments of the Excise Tax Act and the Act on Motor fuels. Additionally, it actively participated, also through its members, in the activities of the Interministerial Group for Trade with Motor fuels. Its activity helped the state authorities to detect tax frauds.

In 2014, ČAPPO member companies contributed to the strengthening of business stability on the markets of fuels and lubricants, in particular by influencing sound and ethical economic competition and provision of services on a standard advanced European level.

The Association joined the activities of the Technological Platform Road Transport where it pursued the problems of motor fuels for road transport focusing on fossil fuels from petroleum and advanced biofuels. In the course of the year, ČAPPO and the Technological Platform Road Transport organised industry workshop Biofuels in Transport. Further, the Association contributed as partner to the project Development of Application Potential within the Operational Program Education for Competitiveness which is managed by the Ministry for Education, Youth and Sports, in the section Motor fuels for Transport, in the form of short-term attachments in the Kralupy refinery works of the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ. The project was successfully completed.

ČAPPO members again achieved excellent results in the 8th year of the PETROLawards 2014.

Late in the year, position of the Association weakened due to the leaving (membership termination) of some of the important members, which fact can paralyse professional potential of the Association. The Council will address the situation within the framework of a general debate concerning priorities of its activities and structure together with all members.

In 2015, legislative issues concerning the petroleum industry will remain the main task. In particular, the Association will continue addressing the measures to fight the tax frauds, the tax laws, rates and excise tax, the use of advanced biofuels in transport, Act on Motor fuels, as well as selected projects of the EU focused on the petroleum industry, protection of the environment, and alternative motor fuels. In the field of technologies, the activities of ČAPPO will focus on the measures to reduce the greenhouse gas emissions resulting from motor fuels combustion. Further, ČAPPO will continue to address issues aimed at better petroleum safety, exchange of information concerning safe operation, setting of the minimum safety standards at service stations, and preparation of technical standards and specialised technical information.

CHARACTERISTICS OF DEVELOPMENT OF PETROLEUM INDUSTRY IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

The situation in the Czech refinery industry and trade developed effectively under given conditions on the world petroleum and petroleum products market, however influenced in the second half of the year in particular by the decrease in prices of petroleum and petroleum products. In particular, the situation resulted in the increase of motor fuels deliveries to the market. The increase of biocomponents content in motor fuels prescribed by the applicable law resulted in lower use of refineries.

In 2014, petroleum imports to the CR were effectuated according to the needs of the refineries as well as sales opportunities for oil products. Total oil imports to the CR in 2014 reached 7,370.4 thousand tons, which is by 12.5% higher than in 2013. Pipeline Družba delivered 50.6% of oil from the total imports to the CR, while the remaining quantity came to the CR through the IKL pipeline.

Thanks to the efforts of the petroleum industry companies, there were no problems with the deliveries of the motor fuels to the market.

Oil processing in the refineries of the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ for the year 2014 totalled 7,495.8 thousand tons, which is by 12.5% higher than in the year 2013. Total volume of processed petroleum also includes 140.5 thousand tons of local petroleum. The processing of oil was influenced by unplanned shutdowns of the refineries.

Expressed in the units of mass, in 2014 the petroleum products imports amounted to 3,080.1 thousand tons, which is an 12.6% increase against the year 2013. Motor fuels (petrol and s) contributed with the highest part, i.e. 69.6% to this result.

In 2014, refineries products exports indicated in the units of mass reached 2,045.6 thousand tons and were higher by 15.2% as compared with 2013. Motor fuels (petrol and s) contributed with the highest part to this result, which must be seen as a success, considering the competition of the surrounding refineries. Export of local petroleum amounted to 26.5 thousand tons, i.e. it was higher than in the previous year by 7.5%.

Total deliveries of selected petroleum products onto the market in the CR in 2014 are shown in Table 1. Data show stock movement.

The deliveries to the market were affected by the level of world prices of petroleum and petroleum products, conditions in the economy and falling purchasing power of people. In consequence of the tightening of the duty to use biofuels in transport, production of pure fossil component for motor fuels production decreased. In 2014, 386.1 thousand tons of fossil component were replaced by first generation biofuels, which represents a 6.5% share in total deliveries of motor fuels.

Based on the result of the statistical check carried out by the Ministry of Industry and Trade, the total of 7,013 service stations and outlets (delivery points) were registered at December 31, 2014 on the territory of the Czech Republic, including 3,792 public and the remaining number of service stations selling to specified entities and non-public facilities. The share of ČAPPO member companies in the total number of public service stations achieved 30.1%. At the end of 2014, the total of 1,674 owners and 1,476 operators of service stations were listed in the Service Stations Register in the public service stations sector.

In the course of the whole year, the Czech Trade Inspection (ČOI) performed general checks of the quality of motor fuels sold at public service stations in compliance with the Decree of the Ministry of Industry and Trade No. 133/2010 Coll. The results of the checks are shown in Table 4.

In 2014, ČAPPO member companies again achieved very good results in the area of quality of sold motor fuels in comparison with the year 2013 in consequence of the application of their own quality checks system, consistent care for quality and use value of motor fuels, certification of manufacturers, distributors and carriers, involvement in the *Seal of Quality Plus* Project as well as to the implementation of the company culture and ethics. Only 0.22% from the samples collected at the facilities of the member companies did not meet the requirements, while the same indicator achieved 3.1% in the total samples collected on the market. The deviations of fuels quality from standard values in the samples from the member companies did not influence the use value and environmental characteristics of motor fuels. The highest rate of defects was recorded for .

Gross consumption of bioethanol for the drive achieved 119.0 thousand tons and rose by 37.7% in comparison with the year 2013. The gross consumption of fatty acids methyl esters achieved 300.4 thousand tons and was by 31.7% higher than in the previous year.

The following major changes were recorded in the area of petroleum industry and trade in 2014:

- In both refineries of the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, a.s., in the refinery of the company PARAMO, a.s., as well as in the distribution company ČEPRO, a.s., motor fuels (petrol and diesel fuel) were blended with the first generation biofuels (bioethanol and fatty acids methyl esters, mainly rape seed oil methyl esters, and imported bioethyl tertiary buthylether) in compliance with the Act on Air Protection. The companies complied with the law and the market did not record significant problems.
- In the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, a.s., discontinuous test production of bioETBE in charges was started. The product was blended with petrol.
- For the year 2014, the Act on Air Protection prescribed the lowering of greenhouse gases emissions from motor fuels combustion by 2% in comparison with the year 2010. The obliged entities achieved lowering by 2.4%.
- In the course of the year, the motor fuels market revived in consequence of the decrease in the prices of petroleum and petroleum products.
- With some unimportant exceptions, petrol Speciál was gradually taken from the market. For older vehicles without hardened valve seats, the appropriate additive is available at the majority of service stations in small quantity packages to be added individually.

- The range of motor fuels stabilised petrol at type E5 and diesel fuel at type B7. Further, fuel E85, diesel blend B30 and B100 (pure FAME/RME), LPG and CNG are available on the market. Due to the tax support, CNG consumption increases.
- Diesel blend was available from 233 public service stations. The total of 148.1 thousand tons was delivered to the market.
- Biodiesel was available from 110 public service stations.
- LPG motor fuel was available from 872 public service stations and filling points.
- CNG motor fuel was available from 39 public service stations and filling points.
- The consumption of LPG motor fuel for transport achieved 75 thousand tons.
- The consumption of CNG for transport achieved 29.912 million m³.
- Fuel E85 was available from 189 public service stations. The total of 23.3 thousand tons was delivered to the market.
- Some of the premium petrols and diesel fuel for "arctic" environment have been delivered to the market without biocomponents.
- The construction of new public service stations and non-public service stations and outlets continued.
- The brand distributor companies developed at their service stations the sale of motor fuels with improved usable qualities (premium motor fuels). They have been offered under individual trade names. Their sales achieved more than 12% from total sales of motor fuels.
- The integration of the service stations market continued within the segment of both brand and non-brand companies.
- In spite of certain partial success, the motor fuels market has been negatively
 affected by the new types of tax frauds. Recently, these frauds included, in particular,
 the misuse of some lubricating oils. ČAPPO contributed by its initiative to the
 amendment of the appropriate regulations to prevent the frauds with VAT evasions.
- On the basis of an analysis of new EU legislation related to the use of biofuels with minimum sustainability criteria and the duty to reduce greenhouse gases emissions from motor fuels combustion until 2020, the petroleum industry companies came to the conclusion that around 2017 it would be necessary to start using products based on the advanced second generation biofuels, to make use of new, up-to-date biocomponents with a high emissions saving in comparison with contemporary products, and to launch to the market more highly concentrated blends of biofuels with fossil fuels. This will require, in particular, amendment of the applicable Acts on Air Protection and on Motor fuels, as well as of their implementing rules. Later, the new technologies should obtain temporary state subsidies.
- In consequence of the regulating measures, increased competition and refinery margins, the petroleum industry had to make efforts to mitigate the impact on economy.
- The negative influences of the regulation measures focused on environment in the area of the petroleum products market are more and more significant; thus, the competitiveness of the market decreases.
- In comparison with the year 2013, total balance (petroleum and petroleum products) exports-imports increased by 12.5% expressed in mass units and by 10.3% in financial terms.
- In December, the Bureau for Protection of Business Competition approved acquisition of a 32.445% share in the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, a.s., from Eni International B.V. for UNIPETROL, a.s. Thus, the company will become the sole shareholder with a 100% share of ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ.

 The company Slovnaft Česká republika, spol. s r.o., purchased from the companies LUKOIL Czech Republic, s.r.o., and Eni Česká republika, s.r.o., their networks of public service stations. The change in their ownership was approved by the Bureau for Protection of Business Competition. Now, the company is the second player on the market based on the number of service stations in the territory of the Czech Republic.

Data concerning oil deliveries and processing, refinery products and service stations market, and the quality of sold motor fuels at the service stations have been taken from the statistical compilations of the Czech Statistical Office, the Ministry of Industry and Trade, the Czech Trade Inspection, and of the Czech Association of Petroleum Industry and Trade as at 31 March, 2015. The abovementioned data in Table 1 were processed by the methodology of the Czech Statistical Office, data in other tables by our methodology.

ACTIVITIES OF THE CZECH ASSOCIATION OF PETROLEUM INDUSTRY AND TRADE

The General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting was held on June 26, 2014. At the Annual General Meeting, the member firms approved the activities and economic results of the Association in the year 2013 and the Annual Report for the year 2013. In the course of the General Meeting, the effectiveness of the new organisation structure of the Association was assessed. The General Meeting noted that the new organisation structure proved successful and worked well. The regular General Meeting was held on December 4, 2014 and approved the Report of the Council about the Activities of the Association, the Programme of Activities for the year 2014, the budget of the Association and the membership fees for the year 2015, noted the preparation of the Priorities Programme for the year 2015 and the next period of time. At the same time, it debated further direction of ČAPPO activities with the aim to strenghten its position in the area of petroleum industry and trade. At the General Meeting, the new Council for the period 2015 and 2016 was elected in a two-round secret ballot. In the above-mentioned years, the Council will be composed of the following member companies: BENZINA, s.r.o, ČEPRO, a.s., OMV Česká republika, s.r.o., Shell Czech Republic a.s., and Slovnaft Česká republika, spol. s r.o.

The Council

In the year 2014, the Council held seven regular and two irregular meeting. It discussed the ordinary ČAPPO agenda with the focus on the effectiveness of the Act on Motor fuels Act No. 234/2013 Coll.) that includes a provision concerning the prevention of and fighting against the tax frauds in motor fuels trading. The Council debated in detail the finding of the Constitutional Court with file No. PI. ÚS 44/13 concerning the issue of security deposits ("bails") for motor fuels distributors. It contributed to the preparation of the amendment of the appropriate provision of Act No. 234/2013 Coll. with the aim to remove the restricting effect of the Act for minor distributors and to maintain its effectiveness.

The Council regularly discussed the activities of ČAPPO Working Groups and of the Secretariat of the Association, cooperation with governmental bodies and institutions – in particular with the Ministry of Industry and Trade (MPO), the Ministry of Finance (MF), the Ministry of Environment (MŽP), the Ministry of Agriculture (MZe) and related professional unions and associations, such as the Association of Chemical Industry of the CR (SCHP ČR) and the Association of Service Stations (SČS ČR), as well as with the automobile professional associations, and the company SGS Czech Republic, s.r.o., the Fuels and Lubricants division.

Taking in to account unfavourable situation concerning the number of members, competition on the market and situation in the area of petroleum industry and trade, the Council started discussions with the members related to direction of ČAPPO's activities and identification of its priorities.

The Council actively co-operated with the Finance Ministry with the aim of initiating the amendments in the legislation concerning VAT and other laws to restrict tax frauds in connection with fuels handling and the misuse of certain lubricating oils in blends with motor fuels. To this end, the Association prepared analyses and presented examples of the tax frauds. Based on this initiative, several regulatory and organisational measures to reduce tax and customs frauds were successfully implemented.

During the whole year, the Council organised the activities of the Working Group Taxes (Daně) and of the ad hoc working sub-groups focused on the restriction of tax frauds in relation to the fuels trading and biofuels. To restrict the tax frauds, the Council prepared a number of analyses of the market situation and draft legislations, in addition to an intense, extensive media campaign.

The Council and the MAZIVA (Lubricants) Section regularly debated legislative issues concerning the marking and colouring of certain mineral oils and marking of certain other mineral oils. In relation to the issue of colouring and marking, the Secretariat prepared

in professional cooperation with some of the members a report about the technologies and products that cannot be coloured and marked due to their use. In the area of petroleum industry and trade, the Council paid particular attention to acts related to the consumption taxes for mineral oils, air protection as well as environmental standards. Further, the Council discussed in detail the issues connected with the regulations and standards concerning the use of biofuels in transport. In the course of the year, the Council debated and approved the programme Measures to Reduce Greenhouse Gases Emissions from Fuels Combustion by 6% by the Year 2020. The analysis of the measures was discussed during a public professional workshop and issued in the form of a memorandum.

Together with the Working Group for biofuels, the Council monitored in detail the application of biofuels by the member companies and supported it with technological solutions.

The Council debated in detail the issue of the observance of two EU directives, namely Directive 2009/28/EC and Directive 2009/30/EC in practice. In this connection, it organised, together with the Working Group for biofuels and Working Group for petroleum industry development, a meeting concerning the use of biofuels in transport and the members of the Council, the technical spokesman of the Association, and the members of the Working Groups attended industry seminars and conferences focused on this theme. The Council successfully initiated organisation of a meeting of the Interministerial Working Group BIOFUELS to draft the appropriate regulations concerning the use of advanced biofuels in transport. At the meeting, a representative of ČAPPO presented the draft of the material Measures to Reduce Greenhouse Gases Emissions from Fuels Combustion by 6% by the Year 2020.

The Council again asked the appropriate ministries and governmental bodies to facilitate a quick resolution to the problem of service stations (in particular non-public / home service stations) that do not comply with law regulations and Czech technical standards. Based on its own decision, ČAPPO continued the review of CSN Standard 73 6060 Service Stations. Further, the Council initiated suggestions for the amendment of the Waste Management Programme till the year 2024.

With a regular frequency, the Council debated the membership of the Association and the observance of the budget.

The Council regularly debated the activities of ČAPPO as partner of the Transport Research Centre CDV v.v.i. in the project called the Development of Application Potential financed by the European Social Fund and the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports within the framework of the operational programme Education for Competitiveness. Within the project, ČAPPO organised, in cooperation with the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, short-term attachments in fuels production facilities of the Kralupy refinery.

The Council did not handle any problem of violation of ethical relationships among the member companies.

The Working Groups

In the year 2014, the permanent Working Groups had ten regular meetings. The agenda of the Working Groups meetings included a whole range of issues from the counselling to the new law regulations from the area of excise taxes and value added tax, environment protection and general regulations, preparation of the programme Measures to Reduce Greenhouse Gases Emissions from Fuels Combustion by 6% by the Year 2020, preparation and realisation of industry and presentation events, the development of the range and quality of motor fuels from 2014 through 2025, the transformation of EU countries' legislation into Czech law in the area of indirect taxes on mineral oils and the use of biofuels in transport, the regular assessment of the situation of fuels and lubricants deliveries to the domestic market and of the situation on the service stations market, to the results of checks of motor fuels quality at service stations performed generally by the Czech Trade Inspection. They debated the experience with fatty acids methylesters blending with diesel fuel and bioethanol blending with petrol.

Representatives of the state administration (of the Ministries of Industry and Trade, Agriculture, Environment, Finance and Transport), universities and professional institutions (SGS Czech Republic, the Research Institute for Agricultural Machinery, and the Czech Metrology Institute) took part in the activities of the Working Groups.

The permanent working groups prepared technical source documents and analyses concerning the drafts of legislative regulations and technical standards.

The appropriate Working Groups debated in detail organisational and technical arrangements for the industry conference organised within PETROLsummit 14, industry conference PRO-ENERGY CON 2014, and own workshops focused on safety at service stations and on the programme of the measures to reduce greenhouse gases emissions from fuels combustion.

ČAPPO Working Groups obtained regularly information about the amendments of EU legislation for chemical industry (REACH), current legislation of the EU and the CR, about the use of biofuels in transport and about the amendments of the technical standards for motor fuels.

The Working Group Fuels and Lubricants met twice and focused, above all, on the analysis of the deliveries of fuels to the market, on the development of the range of motor fuels, the results of checks of motor fuels quality sold at service stations, the installation for the equipment for AdBlue fluid sales, the new regulatory measures and technical standards. It also debated in detail the assessment of the biofuels market and other alternative fuels market. It contributed to the preparation of the programme of the measures concerning the reduction of greenhouse gases emissions from motor fuels combustion within the meaning of the Act on Air Protection. Late in the year, it prepared the analysis of the impacts of the change in the fuels combustion emissions coefficient based on the origin of processed petroleum.

The Working Group Legislation and Ethics held two meetings. It debated current issues of legislation and prepared the general source materials for the amendment of Act No. 234/2013 Coll., on Motor fuels (legislation measures to eliminate tax frauds). It prepared proposal for a change in ČAPPO Statutes in the part related to the rights and obligations of the members of specialized sections of the Association. It provided regular support in the area of legislation to other Working Groups. Members of the Group attended the workshops organized by the General Customs Directorate in relation to the tax law regulations.

The Working Group Taxes (Daně) met twice. It prepared materials related to the amendments of the Act on Motor fuels, the Excise Tax Act and to the decree on colouring and marking of certain mineral oils.

ČAPPO Working Group Safety (Bezpečnost) held four meetings. The group focused its activities on the issues connected with unauthorized (illegal) activities at service stations and committed in the course of motor fuels transportation. The Working Group organized the activities of the ad hoc Working Group Criminality Connected with Motor fuels Distribution that prepared principal documents to suppress the thefts during their filling and transport in tank trucks. For the members, the Working Group organised an international workshop Safety at Service Stations. Representatives of the Police of the CR and of the General Directorate of the Fire and Rescue Brigade attended the workshop. The workshop was assessed as very successful from the professional point of view.

In the area of lubricants, the Fuels and Lubricants Group debated the situation in the area of deliveries of the lubricants to the market and of waste oil collection. Under the presence of the representatives of the governmental bodies it repeatedly debated the position of the Association concerning the contents of Schedules No. 3, the List of Mineral Oils that must not be marked and coloured due to the fact that marking and colouring could cause defects in their use, and No. 4, the List of Mineral Oils that must not be marked and coloured due to the fact that marking and colouring could cause defects in their use according to the Decree of the Ministry of Industry and Trade No. 61/2007 Coll. to determine the details for the marking and colouring of certain mineral oils and marking of certain other mineral oils. The Association believes it is impossible to restrict the use of these oils by

colouring and marking. It supported its position concerning the colouring and marking of mineral oils by expert opinions obtained from the processors of these oils.

Ad hoc Working Groups

In the course of the year 2014, ad hoc Working Groups were also convened to deal with various technical, economic and legislative issues. The Working Groups dealt with a whole range of professional issues. In particular, they debated the effects of amendments of Directives 2009/28/EC and 2009/30/EC in the petroleum industry, the legislation concerning the use of biofuels in the neighbouring countries, the amendment of the Excise Tax Act, draft of governmental decree on sustainability criteria for biofuels, regulations concerning the colouring and marking of certain mineral oils and technical conditions of the stability of with fatty acids methylesters, conditions for the storage of fuels with biocomponents, characteristics of for winter conditions, range of motor fuels after the year 2014 and the preparation of industry events in 2014. Specific attention was paid by them to the equitable determination of differentiated rates of security deposits for motor fuels distributors and to the exclusion of the fleet cards issuers from the obligation of distributors. The Secretariat and the appropriate ad hoc Working Group, on the basis of a contract with the Czech Office for Standards, Metrology, and Testing (ÚNMZ), prepared the amendment of Czech technical standard (ČSN) EN 15376, Motor Fuels - Ethanol as a Component of Petrols - Technical Requirements and Testing Methods, and introduction to the TNI CEN/TR 16680 (ČSN 65 6581), Motor Fuels – Research to the Mechanism of the Development of Internal Sediments in the Injectors of Compression Ignition Engines and the Effect of Corrosion Inhibitors on their Development. Further, ČAPPO ad hoc Working Groups debated the storage and transport of biofuels and their blends with fossil fuels, notification of foreign regulations concerning mineral oils, processing of the comments and positions concerning the amendments and reviews of the Czech technical standards from the field of motor fuels and bitumens, and a number of other issues. The ad hoc Working Group for the amendment of ČSN Standard 73 6060 Service Stations continued the preparation of the amendment of the above-mentioned technical standard in cooperation with outside experts.

In total, ad hoc Working Groups held 21 meetings.

The Secretariat

With the new organisation structure, the Secretariat properly dealt with daily clerical work and organised all the Association's events. It enhanced data and information base on petroleum industry and trade, which is used by the member companies, governmental bodies and the specialists' public. The Secretariat supplied information and data to the member companies, state authorities, institutions, foreign petroleum industry associations, and specialists' community, as well as interns and students. The web site was updated on an ongoing basis. The Secretariat participated in many negotiations with governmental bodies and other institutions and was active in the specialised working groups of the Ministry of Industry and Trade, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Environment, the Ministry of Agriculture, the Ministry of Transport, the Administration of State Material Reserves, the Czech Customs Administration, and the Czech Statistical Office.

The Executive Director attended industry conferences PRO-ENERGY CON 2014 and PETROLsummit 14 and held presentations related to the fuels market during these events. The Executive Director is a member of the National Emergency Sharing Organisation (NESO).

The assistant of the Executive Director is Chairman of the Committee for Products Certification Production and a member of the Board for Waste Management of the CR representing the petroleum industry. He also represents ČAPPO in the Czech Technological Platform for the Use of Bio-components in the Chemical Industry and Transport and in the Technological Platform for the Road Transport, where he holds the position of the administrative board vice-chairman. In addition, he was the responsible person (guarantee) for professional aspects of the project Development of Application Potentials within the

framework of operational programme Education for Competitiveness, controlled by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports, in the part Motor fuels for Transport.

Membership

At December 31, 2014, the following companies terminated their ČAPPO membership based on their requests: Tesco Stores ČR a.s., UNIPETROL RPA, s.r.o., ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, a.s., and MOL Retail Česká republika, s.r.o. At January 1, 2015, the Association had 8 members.

The MAZIVA (Lubricants) Section consists of the existing member firms active in lubricants production, imports and sale, and of the companies Castrol Lubricants (CR), s.r.o., LUKOIL LUBRICANTS EUROPE Oy, organizační složka, PARAMO, a.s., Valar Czech Oil, a.s. a Walmsley enterprises international, s.r.o. (AutoMax). At January 1, 2015, the MAZIVA (Lubricants) Section had 12 members, including five paying members. In 2014, a new professional section Zkapalněné ropné plyny (Liquified Petroleum Gases, LPG) with one member (KRALUPOL a.s.) was established.

On December 4, 2014, the General Meeting approved the establishment of the new section Provozování čerpacích stanic a distribuce pohonných hmot (Service Stations Operation and Motor Fuels Distribution) consisting of HDB, s.r.o., and KM-PRONA, a.s., as its members, of another new section Přeprava pohonných hmot (Motor Fuels Transport) with one member – ABS Bonifer Czech, s.r.o., and of section Alternativní paliva (Alternative Fuels) with one member – AGROFERT, a.s.

The directories, including contact addresses, are annexed.

Programme of ČAPPO Activities

At their regular General Meeting on December 5, 2013, the member companies approved the "Programme of ČAPPO Activities for the Year 2014". The programme focused on the implementation of the new organisation structure of the Association and handling specific technical, economic and legislative issues common to the member companies; on the promotion of ČAPPO prestige with state authorities, institutions and the specialists' public, and on active participation in resolving any issues connected with the Czech Republic's membership in the European Union, and on cooperation with the International Energy Agency (IEA) and the European Standards Commission. Part of the programme also concerned strengthening cooperation with governmental bodies and institutions, the Parliamentary House of Deputies, the Senate of the Parliament of the CR, the nongovernmental bodies and institutions as well as further development of ČAPPO's international contacts. Further, the Programme focused on cooperation with the universities, research and development institutes and specialists' public. Assurance of the expert service for the production and distribution of biofuels in transport in compliance with Directives 2009/28/EC and 2009/30/EC, waste oil management in the practice, improvement of the legislative initiatives of the Association, presentation of ČAPPO's position concerning the use of biofuels in transport, as well as participation in industry events were among CAPPO's technical priorities. The assertion of legislative measures to eliminate tax frauds in motor fuels trading ranked among the main priorities. A whole range of meetings was held in connection with these issues, and the priorities were defined in detail within the activities of CAPPO Council, Working Groups, and Secretariat.

Priorities of the programme have been met as follows:

- Motor fuels quality is monitored by the Czech Trade Inspection according to the Decree of the Ministry of Industry and Trade No. 133/2010 Coll. Again, the results of the member firms for the year 2014 are very good; the frequency of defects is 0.22% of all collected samples. Thus, the result is several-fold better than the results of the rest of the market (3.1%).
- From January 1, 2009 petrol and are marketed containing at most 10 mg/kg of sulphur. Thus, they comply with the quality parameters of ČSN EN 228 and ČSN EN

- 590 standards with a reserve. The average sulphur contents in petrol made 4.6mg/kg and in 5.8mg/kg
- Application of Directive 2009/28/EC on the use of biofuels in transport and the Air Protection Act, part Biofuels. Concentrated activities of the Working Group for advanced biofuels that proposed a number of legislative amendments and addressed the technical problems of production, transport and warehousing of fuels containing bio-components continued. The Working Group and the Secretariat prepared the report on the fulfilment of the obligation of substituting fossil component of motor fuels by biofuels, their implementation in the period 2007 to 2014 in compliance with the Act on Air Protection, and the position of the Association concerning the transposition of amendments of Directives 2009/28/EC and 2009/30/EC, that are in preparation, into Czech law. The persons obliged to substitute the fossil component in motor fuels by biofuels (ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ, ČEPRO and importers) achieved the required volume for the year 2014. The quality of delivered motor fuels was very good and did not cause any breakdowns or defects. A part of the members of the Association made use of the opportunity determined by the appropriate regulation and transferred the excess volumes to the next year. The Working Group and the Secretariat prepared and presented the analytical material concerning the reduction of greenhouse gases emissions from motor fuels combustion by 6% by the year 2020. On the basis of this analysis, they prepared the programme named Measures to Reduce Greenhouse Gases Emissions from Motor fuels Combustion until 2020. Technical problems have not been reported in relation to biofuels blending and use.
- Improvement of ČAPPO's activities in the area of legislation. The Association was included in the interdepartmental counselling procedures of the Ministries of Industry and Trade, of Finance, Agriculture and of Environment. The Working Group for legislation ensured deepening of cooperation at counselling of legislative regulations and provided for the review and amendment of ČAPPO Statutes and internal regulations. Further, the Association cooperated closely with the Czech Confederation of Commerce and Tourism and with the Association of Chemical Industry of the CR. Cooperation in the area of legislation was with the Confederation of Industry and Transport of the Czech Republic continues successfully. The Association ensures its own annotation of the legislative provisions and standards of the CR and the EU from the field of petroleum industry. The Working Group for legislation prepared new internal rules for ČAPPO's legal activities. In the year 2014, the Working Groups and the Secretariat submitted their comments to 10 legislative regulations and 13 technical standards. In cooperation with the members, the Secretariat prepared source materials for the audit of the 2014 legislation from the environmental point of view (EKOAUDIT).
- The Council and the Working Group Taxes (Daně) succeeded, in effective cooperation
 with the state authorities (the Ministry of Industry and Trade, Finance Ministry, the
 General Financial Directorate and the General Customs Directorate), in the
 preparation of a proposal for the differentiation of motor fuels distributors' security
 deposits to remove its restricting effect for small distributors in the form of an
 amendment of the Act on Motor fuels (No. 234/2013 Coll.).
- Waste oil handling. Debate concerning practical experience from the area of waste oil handling. The Association contributed to the preparation of the draft of the Implementation Programme of Waste Management for the area of the waste oil management. It also submitted its comments to the theses of the new Act on Wastes and the Programme for the Waste Management till the Year 2024.
- Adjustment to the conditions of doing business in the EU. The Working Groups cooperated with the experts from the state administration and with the association of European petroleum firms – FuelsEurope in the implementation of selected EU programmes.

- The Association intensified its educational activities. It organised 3 industry seminars on its own and contributed to additional 5 conferences, workshops and seminars, one of them international.
- Cooperation between ČAPPO and the Association of Chemical Industry of the Czech Republic, focused on exchange of information, cooperation in the area of legislation and programme Responsible Care, continued.
- The Association cooperated intensively with the bodies of the state administration, in particular with the Ministries of Industry and Trade, Finance, Environment, Transport, with the Administration of State Material Reserves, the Czech Customs Administration, the Czech Trade Inspection, Czech Office for Standards, Metrology, and Testing, Czech Metrology Institute, and the Czech Statistical Office.
- Within the framework of cooperation of ČAPPO with the company PETROLmedia, six PR articles were published: they focused on the problems of safety during petroleum products handling in warehouses, transport and distribution at service stations. Further, the Executive Director gave interview to the Hospodářské noviny Daily, the magazines Prosperita, PETROLmagazine, and PRO-ENERGY related to the problems of petroleum industry and the effectiveness of Act No. 234/2013 Coll. The technical spokesman of the Association explained repeatedly the issues related to petroleum industry on TV.
- The Association contributed to the activities of the Czech Technological Platform for the Use of Bio-components in Chemical Industry and Transport, and to the activity of the Technological Platform Road Transport and prepared the study Final Draft of the Strategic Research Agenda as well as part New Motor Fuels for Road Transport of the Implementation Action Plan.
- ČAPPO has been involved as partner in the project Development of Application Potential within the framework of operational programme Education for Competitiveness, financed by the European Social Fund and by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports, in the part Motor fuels for Transport. It organised two short-term attachments for students of the Faculty of Transport of Jan Perner of the Pardubice University in the refinery of the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ at Kralupy.
- ČAPPO and some of the member companies took part in the project of the National Council of Handicapped People "We help people with handicaps. Join us".

PRINCIPAL ISSUES DEBATED IN 2014

The Council, Working Groups and Secretariat handled a wide range of specialised issues.

Provision of information

In the course of the whole year, the Secretariat prepared its own innovated quarterly information formats Deliveries of Main Petroleum Products to the Market in the CR (a public format) and the Lubricants Deliveries to the Market in the CR (internal format). With a monthly frequency, simplified statements related to the deliveries of fuels, lubricants and bitumens to the market were prepared. The source of data for the reports are historical aggregated data about domestic deliveries obtained from the Czech Statistical Office, the aggregated information about imports and exports from the Ministry of Industry and Trade, and the aggregated data about the change in the stock level in warehouses of the state and business entities from the Czech Statistical Office.

During the whole year, the processing of the Association's own information system related to the sales (dispensation) of motor fuels (petrol and) expressed in the units of volume, revenues at service stations, and the number of washing cycles in washers at service station continued with a monthly frequency and accumulatively. The statement was confronted with the statement concerning the deliveries of main petroleum products.

In 2014, the Association continued its participation in the activities of the working groups of the Czech Statistical Office and the Ministry of Industry and Trade that deal with the statistical reports in the area of petroleum and petroleum products according to the requirements of the European Union and the International Energy Agency, and the introduction of new customs codes for certain mineral oils in compliance with regulation No 1006/2011 of (EU) Commission, to amend Schedule I of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2658/87 on the tariff and statistical nomenclature and on the Common Customs Tariff.

On the basis of source materials obtained from the Czech Trade Inspection, the results of the checks of quality of motor fuels sold at service stations were processed with a monthly frequency.

Based on individual order, the Secretariat prepared additional information about the historical development of mass deliveries of fuels to the market, or their prognosis, classified based on their range and quality.

In addition, the Secretariat collects and distributes to the members and the Working Groups various technical and legislative information as published by the international organisation FuelsEurope and EU working commissions. It works in the same way also with information obtained from the domestic sources, for example from the Association of Industry and Transport of the CR and from the Association of Czech Chemical Industry of the CR.

Legislation and Czech Technical Standards

The Association, through its Council, Working Groups and Secretariat, prepared and drafted several legislative initiatives and counselled the bills and Decrees submitted by governmental bodies, of which the most important are as follows:

- Act No. 331/2014 Coll., amending the Act on Excise Taxes, as amended, and other related acts (effective from January 1, 2015);
- Draft of amendment of Act No. 353/2003 Coll., on Excise Taxes, as amended (effective from July 1, 2015);
- Draft of amendment of the Act on Prevention of Serious Breakdowns Caused by Selected Hazardous Substances or Chemical Blends;
- Amendment of Decree No. 61/2007 Coll., determining the details of the marking and colouring of selected mineral oils and marking of certain other mineral oils, in the wording effective as at July 1, 2012;
- Decree No. 338/2014 Coll. to amend Decree No. 237/2005 Coll. to determine the height of technically substantiated loss during mineral oils transport and warehousing, as amended;
- Review of CSN Standard 65 6691 Petroleum Products Waste Oils Based Heating Oils – Technical Requirements and Testing Methods;
- Review of ČSN Standard 73 6060 Service Stations.

In addition, ČAPPO contributed through its Secretariat and Working Groups to the debates concerning 8 general regulations. The Secretariat has regularly elaborated a quarterly survey on newly adopted Czech legislation, which relates to the activities in the petroleum industry and trade. Similarly, it elaborated semi-annual summaries of the regulations (Decisions, Regulations, and Directives) of the EU. The summaries are distributed among the member companies and members of the Working Group for legislation and of other Working Groups of the Association.

Legislative activities focused on the abatement of tax frauds connected with motor fuels trading ranked with the most important activities of the Association in the year 2014.

Economic Benefits from ČAPPO Activities

Within its activities in the area of legislation and its organisational activities, the Council and ČAPPO members succeeded in 2014, among other, in pushing the following change with economic effect through the appropriate authorities:

• Suggestions of the legislative measures to reduce the tax evasions related to the motor fuels trading through the Act on Motor fuels (the establishment of security deposits, restricted access to the registry of distributors, establishment of trading certificates for the fuels traders).

State Authorities

Through its Council, Secretariat, and Working Groups, the Association maintained its professional contacts with the Ministry of Industry and Trade (division of gas industry and liquid fuels and department of power industry statistics). With the Deputy Minister of Industry and Trade and the Director of the Gas Industry and Liquid Fuels, it debated the deepening of communication and more intensive support to ČAPPO's suggestions and revival of the activities of interministerial BIOPALIVA (Biofuels) Group. In particular, fuel quality monitoring in compliance with EU Directives No. 2003/17/EC and No. 2003/30/EC, the development of an alternative fuel range after the year 2014, the improvement of quality of statistical surveys. adjustment to the conditions of doing business in the EU, the substitution of oil fuels by their alternatives by the year 2020 till 2030, the programme for further use of biofuels in transport in compliance with Directives 2009/28/EC and 2009/30/EC, and the amendment of Decrees No. 61/2007 Coll. and No. 237/2005 Coll. were discussed. The Executive Director and the Secretariat regularly attended the meetings of working groups and commissions of experts of the Ministry of Industry and Trade related to the area of fuels, checks of biofuels, the amendment of the Act on Motor fuels, amendment of Decrees No. 61/2007 Coll, and No. 237/2005 Coll., and information surveys concerning the deliveries of fuels. The Association contributed to the counselling process related to the documents of the Ministry of Industry and Trade, to the amendment of the National Action Plan for Energy from Renewable Sources and the Energy Security of the CR. The Association prepared a number of comments concerning the audit of the legislation for the area of water management, air protection and administrative requirements. In cooperation with some of the members, the Secretariat prepared source materials for the review of legislative regulations related to the environment (EKOAUDIT 2014).

With the Ministry of Finance, the Association and its Working Group Taxes (Daně) mainly cooperated in addressing current technical and legislative issues of the Excise Tax Act and the Value Added Tax Act in practice. Further, it contributed to the preparation of additional measures to reduce tax evasions using the substitution of petroleum and petrochemical products and value added tax evasions in connection with fuels trading. It initiated a debate concerning the Reverse Charge for motor fuels. ČAPPO Working Groups and Secretariat provided the Czech Customs Administration (GŘC) with technical advice. At the meetings held in the course of the year, problems of the measures aimed at the limiting of tax evasions using the substitution of petroleum and petrochemical products in connection with trading in motor fuels were debated. ČAPPO members attended seminars (workshops) focused on excise taxed (documents used during transport, authorization proceedings). organised by the General Customs Directorate

The Association cooperated with the Ministry of Environment regarding dangerous substance and greenhouse gases emissions into the air and dealing with wastes and packagings, and the amendments of related binding regulations. The main attention was focused on the legislation related to the use and reporting of biofuels that comply with the sustainability criteria and the methodology of proving reduction of greenhouse gases emissions from motor fuels combustion within the meaning of the Act on Air Protection. Some of the member companies and the Secretariat participate in the activities of the Working Group for the implementation of the conditions of Act No. 76/2002 Coll. on Integrated Protection and Pollution Reduction and on Integrated Pollution Registry and

Amendment of Some Acts in the Area of Oil and Natural Gas Processing, and attend regular seminars. Nevertheless, the main activity was cooperation in the field of the use of biofuels in transport in compliance with the new legislation of the European Union.

Members of the MAZIVA (Lubricants) Section and the Secretariat attended the meetings of the working group focused on the preparation of the Implementation Programme for Wastes Management for the period 2015 till 2024.

With the Ministry of Agriculture, ČAPPO cooperated in the area of the use of bioethanol and rape seed oil methyl ester (RME) as fuel components in compliance with Directive 2003/30/EC, and the list of biofuels producers.

The Association regularly exchanged information with the Administration of State Material Reserves on activities of the International Energy Agency and EU expert commissions and committees. The Association regularly provided the Administration with statistical data and received in return basic information concerning the situation in the area of world and European petroleum and petroleum products markets, and information from the Energy Sector of the European Commission. The Executive Director and some of the member companies are members of the committee of the National Emergency Sharing Organisation (NESO) for dealing with the crisis caused by oil shortages.

The Czech Statistical Office obtained from ČAPPO basic methodological explanations to statistical data on petroleum and petroleum products. At the same time, the Association participated in the preparation of the yearly report Petroleum and Petroleum Products in compliance with the methodology of the International Energy Agency, conversion codes for motor fuels, and classification of biofuels in the TARIC system. The Association debated with the Czech Statistical Office the new format for reporting imports and exports of mineral oils within EU countries.

In cooperation with the related member companies, the Association prepared amendments and reviews of Czech technical standards and the Secretariat, as well as the representatives of some of the member companies, took part in the meetings of technical standard commission named Petroleum and Petroleum Products (TNK 118).

Using its own capacities and based on contract agreed with the Czech Office for Standards, Metrology and Testing, the Association prepared a review of two Czech technical standards.

Further, the Association cooperated with the Czech Trade Inspection on the methodology of checks of quality parameters of motor fuels, and accepted summary results on the quality of motor fuels sold at service stations. The appropriate Working Group prepared legislative proposals concerning the Act on Motor fuels and Decree No. 133/2010 Coll. on categories of deviations in the area of motor fuels according to their magnitude.

With the Czech Metrology Institute, the Association cooperated on elaboration and review of the binding regulations in the area of metrology and safety. Members of the Working Groups for safety acquainted themselves with the new measuring devices for metrology. In this relation, a presentation was organized in cooperation with the Czech Trade Inspection at a BENZINA service station in Prague 7 to explain the checks of measuring of motor fuels delivery to the vehicles.

With the Czech Environment Inspection, ČAPPO debated the methodology of the checks of observance of the measures provided in the Act on Chemical Substances and Chemical Mixtures (Act No. 350/2011 Coll.).

Committees of the Czech Parliament's Chamber of Deputies and the Senate

The Association provided the Economic and Budget Committee of the Parliament's Chamber of Deputies with basic data and information from the petroleum industry and trade and, on demand, with consultation. Through the Deputies of the Parliament of the CR, it informed about the suggestions for amendments of some acts (Act on Excise Tax and the Air Protection Act). In cooperation with some of the members, ČAPPO prepared the contents (agenda) and source materials for a seminar with the theme tax frauds in the area of motor fuels trading from the point of view of the Constitutional Court's finding.

Media and Presentations

The Chairman and the members of the Council, the Executive Director, the technical spokesman and the Secretariat presented ČAPPO activities in several articles and information in the dailies and economic periodicals, in specialist motoring and petroleum industry magazines. The Chairman, the Executive Director, the technical spokesman and other members of the Council gave significant interviews to the dailies Hospodářské noviny, MF Dnes, Právo, E 15, as well as to the EURO weekly, the Prosperita Magazine and other media (PETROLmagazín, PRO ENERGY magazine) about the use of first generation biofuels in transport and other issues connected with the petroleum industry, such as the development of the market, range of products and quality of motor fuels. Members of the Working Group Safety (Bezpečnost) prepared a series of articles concerning safety at service stations and motor fuels distribution. The articles were published in PETROLmagazín. The Secretariat and the members of ČAPPO Working Groups prepared a series of articles for magazines, bulletins and the media of the member companies. These were mainly information on activities within petroleum industry and the activities of ČAPPO.

The representatives of some member companies, the Executive Director and the technical spokesman repeatedly explained the problems of tax evasions, the effectiveness of the Act on Motor fuels, the use of biofuels in transport, and the situation of the petroleum industry on ČT1, ČT24 and TV Nova stations.

Some of the members of the Council, members of ČAPPO Working Group Fuels and Lubricants and the Executive Director presented ČAPPO's position concerning the use of alternative fuels in transport at a number of industry events, among other at the industry conference PETROLsummit 14 and at industry events PRO ENERGY CON 2014 and REOTRIB 2014.

The Secretariat updated regularly the Association's web pages.

ČAPPO MAIN EVENTS

The Council of the Association and the Secretariat organised industry workshops and meetings concentrated on:

- International seminar Safety at Service Stations;
- Seminar (workshop) Biofuels in transport (under the support of the Technological Platform Road Transport):

- Open meeting of the Working Group Advanced Biofuels (Vyspělá biopaliva) related to alternative fuels.

ČAPPO INTERNATIONAL CONTACTS

In 2014, the Association continued specialist cooperation with the FuelsEurope organisation regarding petroleum industry and environment protection. Working Groups, member companies, ČAPPO external collaborators, and other professional organisations and state authorities use the materials. In professional relationships, contacts concerning the use of fuels and biofuels, and taxes prevailed.

Foreign associations provided ČAPPO with important information concerning service stations market, standards related to natural gas for drive and the use of biofuels in transport and their economic support, and the implementation of the tax laws and regulations.

On request, the Secretariat provided information and consultations to foreign scholars with the member companies, to foreign associations and other persons from among international expert public, in particular students of the universities with specialisations in the technical fields and economics.

ČAPPO DOMESTIC CONTACTS

The Association of Chemical Industry of the CR, the Confederation of Industry and Transport of the CR, the Union of Independent Traders in Petroleum Industry of the CR, the Union of Car Importers, the Association of Automotive Industry, the Association of Importers and Producers of Automotive Parts and Service Equipment, the Czech Association LPG, the Bio-Diesel Producers Association, the Czech Confederation of Commerce and Tourism

The Association maintains regular contacts with the above mentioned related professional unions and associations based on exchange of information, statistical data, and mutual attendance at specialised events. In 2014, ČAPPO continued in particular its cooperation in the area of counselling legislative regulations with the Czech Confederation of Commerce and Tourism, the Association of Chemical Industry of the CR, and the Confederation of Industry and Transport of the CR. The cooperation with the Union of Independent Traders in Petroleum Industry of the CR continued, in particular in the area of legislation and measures to limit tax evasions in relation to trading in motor fuels and the review of some of the technical standards from the area of service stations. The Automotive Industry Association and the Car Importers Union provided ČAPPO with the materials concerning motor vehicles market and composition in the Czech Republic. With the Union of Car Importers, ČAPPO has discussed the issue of current and future development of the cars market in the CR, the types of drive and the use of biofuels in transport, as well as the issue of the characteristics of for winter conditions and the technology of AdBlue additive distribution. The Union of Car Importers provided ČAPPO with its analysis of the cars fleet in the CR classified according to the age of the cars, the type of drive and greenhouse gases emissions. A representative of the Car Importers Union took part, as necessary, at the meetings of the Working Group Fuels and Lubricants (Paliva a maziva). With the Association of Bio-diesel Producers, CAPPO debated the experience with the blending of biofuels with. the use biodiesel mix and pure FAME on the market, as well as RME quality parameters. The Association of Importers and Producers of Automotive Parts and Service Technology provided ČAPPO with its information about lubricants, use of biofuels in transport and REACH.

The Institute of Petroleum Technology and Alternative Fuels of the University of Chemistry and Technology Prague

The Association cooperated with experts from the Institute on harmonizing Czech regulations with the ISO standards on petroleum industry nomenclature, improvement of quality parameters of fuels and lubricants, and handling operation problems. Further, the problems with the definition of food and non-food biomass were addressed. At a meeting with the Rector and other scientific employees of the Institute, issues related to cooperation

in the area of alternative fuels were addressed. The staff of the Institute participated in ČAPPO's professional events.

SGS Czech Republic, s.r.o.

The Association cooperates with the company SGS on material issues concerning quality parameters checks of motor fuels at service stations, the definition of the significant deviations of petrol and from the applicable technical standards and certifications, criteria of biofuels sustainability. ČAPPO supported the project "Identification of Deviations in Motor fuels Quality from the Standards, their Causes and Sources and the Development of Processes Leading to Minimization of the Negative Impacts on Environment Cars Operation Reliability and National Fiscal Politics". ČAPPO has its representative in the Committee for Certification of Fuels and Lubricants. The employees of the company attended the events organised by ČAPPO and held a presentation focused on analyses of quality of motor fuels in the CR and annotations of standards from the field of quality characteristics of petroleum industry products and testing and certification of fuels and lubricants and comparison of quality parameters of alternative fuels. In particular, cooperation related to the use of biofuels in transport and the implementation of own systems of checks of the Seal of Quality PLUS (Pečeť jakosti PLUS) type were important.

Project Development of the Application Potential, in part Motor fuels for Transport

ČAPPO cooperated as partner with the Transport Research Centre, v.v.i., within the implementation of the project Development of Application Potential, supported from the European Social Fund and by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports of the CR within the framework of Operational Programme Education for Competitiveness. Within the project, two short-term attachments for the undergraduates and PhD students from the Faculty of Transport of Jan Perner of the Pardubice University and scientist from the Transport Research Centre were organized in the refinery of the company ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ at Kralupy with the theme motor fuels production and use. At June 30, 2014, the project was successfully completed.

Technological Platform Road Transport

ČAPPO, ČEPRO and ČESKÁ RAFINÉRSKÁ contributed to the activity of the Technological Platform Road Transport. Within the framework of the fourth phase (project sustainability), the study named Final SVA and IAP draft New Motor Fuels for Road Transport was prepared.

PETROLmedia

In compliance with the agreement with the company PETROLmedia, the Association prepared six articles for PETROLmagazin. The articles focused on the issues connected with the safety at service stations and motor fuels distribution. The Association and some of the member companies took active part in the industry conference within the event PETROLsummit 14 and in the PETROLawards 14 contest. Again, members of the Association and important persons from the member companies succeeded significantly in the contest.

Other contacts

The Association cooperates, through its Working Groups and the Secretariat, with specialists from the division of technical research and aggregates management at ŠKODA AUTO, a.s., Mladá Boleslav, the Research Institute for Agricultural Machinery, the Central Customs Laboratories of the Czech Customs Administration and relevant customs administration offices. The range of debated issues includes technical, legislation, and economic themes from the area of liquid and alternative fuels, the development of motor fuels range, and AdBlue liquid distribution.

Data and Information Base

In 2014, in cooperation with ČAPPO member companies, the Secretariat enhanced its data and information base. The documents are available to the member companies, governmental bodies and the specialists' public. In 2014, the Association updated its own web site. ČAPPO web pages include ČAPPO Annual Reports, the lectures from the industry seminars and other events, information concerning the deliveries of fuels to the market, professional articles and information from the members of ČAPPO Working Groups.

- Preparation and advocacy of draft legislation concerning the fight against all types of tax frauds in motor fuels trading and in biofuels;
- Amendment of the measures to reduce greenhouse gases emissions resulting from motor fuels combustion and the observance of the criteria for biofuels sustainability within the meaning of the Act on Air Protection;
- Cooperation with the appropriate bodies of state administration in the field of the fight against corruption and unfair competition;
- Preparation and implementation of the programme Modernization of ČAPPO's Activities.
